ACTIVITIES & ACHIEVEMENTS

Your Board of Directors met a total of five times since the last AGM on:

The Engineers Foundation's achievements over the past year include:

1. Student Awards

The Engineers Foundation distributed a total of \$155,000 in award monies between September 2016 and May 2017 across all of Ontario's fifteen CEAB-accredited engineering schools. A total of 118 students were recipients of the Foundation's awards, of which over 30% were women engineering students.

Since the Foundation was created in 1959, over \$2.9 million dollars of student funding has been invested in 3248 engineering students across Ontario.



Entrance Scholarship (\$1,500 each, 2 per school, 50% female recipients)

A total of \$45,000 was given to 30 first year engineering students who attained high academic standing in their final year of high school and were assessed to be well-rounded students with leadership characteristics. In each school, one male student and one female student received this scholarship. Over the past 20 years, the Engineers Foundation has awarded over \$305,000 in scholarships to women entering engineering programs in Ontario.



Undergraduate Scholarship (\$1,500 each, 2-8 per school based on enrolment)

A total of \$108,000 was given to 72 undergraduate engineering students in either their 2nd, 3rd or 4th year of studies who exhibited exceptional role model qualities through participation in professional and non-academic activities while maintaining above average marks.

Gold Medal (no cash value, 1 per school)

A total of 15 graduating engineering students were awarded the Foundation's Gold Medal for achieving the highest academic standing in their final year. The medals were inscribed with the student's name and were mostly presented at convocation ceremonies to an audience of the students' peers.



Leader for the Future Award (\$2,000, 1 per year)

The 2016-17 Leader for the Future award was given to Christine Bui, a Chemical Engineering student at the University of Toronto. The award was presented at the Engineers Without Borders annual conference in Edmonton, Alberta on January 14, 2017. The award is given to an Ontario engineering student completing a volunteer placement with EWB.

2. Engineering Community Engagement

In 2016-2017, the Engineers Foundation was advertised in PEO's Engineering Dimensions magazine, Canada's highest circulated engineering publication reaching a total audience of 188,545.

Engagement with Ontario's Engineering Schools

The Engineers Foundation has worked this past year to strengthen its relationships with Ontario's 15 engineering schools. The Deans of engineering, the engineering faculty members and the central awards officers are key partners in the success of delivering our awards program since they select the awardees according to the Foundation's criteria.

Donor agreements were signed with the University of Waterloo, University of Toronto and University of Windsor. The objective of these agreements is to provide universities with assurance of the Foundation's multi-year giving and to ensure that:

- All Engineers Foundation awardees meet our criteria and all monies are distributed within the same academic year;
- Every effort is made to arrange a suitable award ceremony among the students' peers with participation by at least one representative of the Engineers Foundation;
- Awardees are invited to join PEO's and OSPE's student membership programs and establish ongoing contact with the Foundation; and
- Engineering schools are invited to provide feedback to the Foundation on ways to improve the effectiveness of our awards programs.

During the 2016-2017 academic year, the Engineers Foundation participated in a total of 18 university award ceremonies at 13 of the 15 universities that received funding. The Foundation is grateful for the volunteers from the Board, the membership, the PEO Chapters (East Toronto, Hamilton-Burlington, Lakehead, Lake Ontario, London, Mississauga and Ottawa) and from PEO Council who helped present the Foundation's awards.

Engagement with Ontario's Engineering Associations




In the 2016-2017 year, the Engineers Foundation received generous donations and inkind support from Professional Engineers Ontario (PEO) and the Ontario Society of Professional Engineers (OSPE).

PEO continued to administer donations from its members to the Engineers Foundation through the annual PEO fee renewal form. PEO also provided the Foundation in-kind support through office and meeting space, IT and mailroom support, graphics and communications assistance, and hosting the Foundation's annual meeting.

The Engineers Foundation was invited for the first time to address PEO's members at their annual meeting in Thunder Bay on April 22, 2017. The following table-top display was created for the meeting to promote awareness of the Foundation.





OSPE provided the Foundation in-kind support during the year including accounting assistance and the preparation of our financial records for our annual audit, graphic design support, hosting two Foundation board meetings at their head office, and the opportunity to address their membership at their annual meeting on May 4, 2017.

The Foundation is extremely grateful to PEO and OSPE for their continued support.

The Foundation also welcomed two new members from PEO chapters: Juwairia Obaid, P.Eng., Vice-Chair of the Mississauga Chapter, and Arthur Sinclair, P.Eng., Chair of the East Toronto Chapter. Since 2015, PEO chapters have had the opportunity to elect annually an executive member in good standing and request that they be a member of the Foundation. We welcome our new chapter members and look forward to their contributions.

3. Donor Engagement

The Foundation continued its fundraising plan to increase both the quantity and dollar amount of donations received from engineers. Monthly mailings were sent to PEO members who had previously donated to the Foundation, one month prior to their annual PEO fee renewal. The mailing reminds the engineer to make a donation by checking off the FFE box at the same time when they send in their annual PEO fee payment. This initiative has resulted in a 3% increase in the 2016 calendar year versus the previous year in PEO member donations.



Our goal is to make the Engineers Foundation top-of-mind within Ontario's engineering community and the charity of choice for Ontario engineers.

FINANCIAL RESULTS

The Foundation's total revenue for 2016 was \$216,991 versus \$189,081 in 2015, an increase of \$27,910 or close to 15%. The increase was primarily a result of increased investment revenues. Donations received from individual engineers and PEO members were \$102,029 in 2016 versus \$99,322 in 2015, an increase of \$2,702 or 2.7%. Investment income saw an increase from \$80,465 in 2015 to \$110,675 in 2016, an increase of \$30,210 or 27.3%. Donations from corporations, associations and other sources totaled \$2,169 in 2016 versus \$3,110 in 2015, a decrease of \$931 or 42.9%.

The Foundation's expenses were \$38,011 in 2016 versus \$34,242 in 2015, an increase of \$3,769 or 9.9% due to increased fees to collect the increased donations through online portal, increased administrative support for bookkeeping, and increased travel costs to present the scholarships. Scholarships and awards totaled \$166,001 in 2016 versus \$164,539 in 2015.

There was a resulting surplus of \$12,979 in 2016 versus a deficit of \$9,700 in 2015 due to the increased donation and investment income. The Foundation is pleased to report it received a clean audit for 2016.

The directors and staff of the Foundation continue to manage expenses carefully to maximize the percentage of each revenue dollar that goes directly to our award recipients. Expenses in 2016 represented 36% of donations received, and scholarships and awards represented 159% of donations. The Foundation is currently issuing scholarships and awards of a total greater value than total annual donations it receives; however, this gap continues to with fundraising being a top priority for the board of directors.

The long-term goal of the Foundation is to increase both the value and the quantity of scholarships that it issues to students to continue to help defray the rising cost of an engineering tuition, expected to be over \$100,000 during an undergraduate degree.
